Sure, they might be popular things in sophomore dorm rooms, but it's hard to deny the hypnotic appeal of surrealists like Salvador Dalí and M.C. Escher, the guy who did that "trippy stairs print" (you know, the one where people are walking sideways and stuff). Rockland has its own acid-flashback artist in Win Zibeon, a Blauvelt-based painter who will be showing his work at the Piermont Flywheel Gallery through July 6.

Zibeon's technique can make a 2-D seem 3-D at first glance, so before you swat at that insect on the canvas, take a moment to get some perspective. He also wrestles with environmental issues, and in "I Told You Not to Shake the Bottle," a tranquil, lakeside landscape portrait is flecked with splashes of black ink—and that can't bode well. One drawback: His paintings aren't available as posters ... yet.
